Scripture Reading | Psalm 34:15-18

Killing Sin and Living By The Spirit

1. Putting sin to death is the duty of the believer
2. Putting sin to death is by the power of the Holy Spirit

Why Must Sin Be Put To Death?

1. Sin is active and indwelling
2. Sin hardens our hearts toward the gospel and others

What Does It NOT Mean To Put Sin to Death? What Does It Mean?

1. Killing sin is NOT behavior modification
2. Killing sin is NOT quieting sin
3. Killing sin is NOT deflecting
4. Killing Sin IS habitual weakening
5. Killing sin IS constantly fighting

How Do We Put Sin To Death?

1. Abide in Christ
2. Spiritual disciplines
3. Know your particular sins
4. Know the warning signs of those sins
5. Be committed to universal obedience
