2. Where you are

- a. Where you are is not random, but fact. Therefore, what you are facing or what you are working through is not oblivious to the Lord. In the context of marriage and relationships, it's a question of what roots you.
 - i. "A marriage of love, unity, and understanding is not rooted in romance; it is rooted in worship." (Paul Tripp)

3. Who you are

- a. Belonging to Christ means that you are first a worshipper. That is, everything you do is affected by who you are (i.e. decisions, thoughts, habits, etc.).
- b. In the context of relationships, we must consider what or who we worship because everything can be "good."
 - i. Idolatry: Anything or anyone that takes the position and place of God in our lives.
